



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: 560,000 people are injured yearly in alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes; and
- WHEREAS: The majority of people killed or injured in alcohol-related crashes are between 15 and 29 years of age; and
- WHEREAS: Teenage alcohol impaired motor vehicle crashes cost society over \$6 billion annually; and
- WHEREAS: Spinal cord and brain injuries to teenagers are most often caused by motor vehicle accidents; and
- WHEREAS: Sister Kenny Institute and Minnesota Mothers Against Drunk Driving have shown leadership in developing a public service campaign to reduce this catastrophe which besets our teenage population; and
- WHEREAS: The communities of Alexandria, Brainerd, Mankato and Marshall have shown strong community leadership by supporting the kickoff of this "Safe Summer, 1988" campaign;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May, 1988 to be

"STUDENT SAFE DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH"
