

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF THE
HONORABLE ROBERT J. BREUNIG, JUDGE OF
DISTRICT COURT, FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT,
STATE OF MINNESOTA, FOR A DISABILITY
RETIREMENT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF
MINNESOTA STATUTES, SECTION 490.121, SUBD.
13 AND 14.

WHEREAS, the Honorable Robert F. Breunig, Judge of District Court, First Judicial District, State of Minnesota, has submitted his written application for a disability retirement.

WHEREAS, the said Judge Robert J. Breunig has stated in his application that he has become physically incapacitated from performing his judicial duties during the remainder of his term in office; and

WHEREAS, the physical incapacity of said Judge Robert J. Breunig has been attested to by Kenneth C. Caldwell, M.D., 750 Doctors Professional Building, St. Paul, Minnesota and verified by E. Theodore Palm, M.D., Minnesota Department of Health; and

WHEREAS, the said Honorable Robert J. Breunig has served as Judge of District Court since January 8, 1964; and

WHEREAS, the said Honorable Robert J. Breunig has satisfied the necessary legal requirements established under Minnesota Statutes Sections 490.121 to 490.132 for such retirement at the close of business on May 31, 1988.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RUDY PERPICH, Governor of the State of Minnesota, acting in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes Chapter 490, do hereby order and direct the retirement of the Honorable Robert J. Breunig, Judge of District Court, First Judicial District, State of Minnesota, said retirement to be made effective on May 31, 1988. He shall become entitled thereafter to such retirement compensation provided under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes Chapter 490. I hereby direct that this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.
