The Guthrie Theater opened on May 7, 1963 with a production of William Shakespeare's  $\underline{\textit{Hamlet}},$  directed by Tyrone Guthrie; and WHEREAS:

The Guthrie Theater has continually provided actors, directors, designers and all other theater artists the opportunity to cultivate their art; and WHEREAS:

The Guthrie Theater has been influential in attracting new community citizens from all over the world to live in our area, serving as a cultural resource for the entire Upper WHEREAS:

The intimate relationship between audience and stage, artist and community has for 25 years continued to be the source of strength sustaining the Guthrie; and WHEREAS:

The Guthrie Theater has been the acknowledged leader in the American Regional Theater WHEREAS:

The Guthrie, after 25 years, 150 plays, 6500 performances and 7 million theatergoers, resonates with renewed vitality and energy; WHEREAS:
