

## **Proclamation**

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota is graced with abundant lake and wetland resources; and

The non-native plant purple loosestrife is invading Minnesota's wetlands and lakeshores, displacing valuable native vegetation and degrading wildlife habitat; and WHEREAS:

Purple loosestrife threatens to cause economic loss to the state by reducing hunting, fishing and trapping opportunities and reducing harvest of wild rice; and WHEREAS:

Purple loosestrife has diminished the natural heritage of significant historical sites in Minnesota such as Voyageur's National Park and Fort Snelling State Park; and WHEREAS:

Wet pastures and drainage ditches in the agricultural regions of Minnesota are becoming infested with purple loosestrife; and

The Department of Agriculture has declared purple loosestrife one of the state's WHEREAS:

noxious weeds; and

The Legislative Commission on Minnesota's Resources has approved and funded a Purple Loosestrife Program to curb the spread of purple loosestrife in Minnesota; and WHEREAS:

Public awareness and cooperation is a key component of the statewide control efforts and Minnesotans should recognize the threats purple loosestrife pose to our resources; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 7-13, 1988 to be
