REMARKS BY GLENCOE CHARTER COMMISSIONERS
The first of the proposed charter is the name of the city. It is proposed that the name of the city be changed from "Glencoe" to "Enterprise". This is proposed because the name "Enterprise" is more descriptive of the city's character and is more easily pronounced. The second of the proposed charter is the form of government. It is proposed that the city be governed by a mayor and a city council. The mayor shall be elected for a term of two years and shall have the honor and precedence of a mayor. The city council shall consist of five members, each elected for a term of two years. The council shall have the power to pass ordinances, to levy taxes, and to manage the city's affairs. The third of the proposed charter is the method of electing the mayor and council members. It is proposed that the mayor and council members be elected by the voters of the city at a general election. The fourth of the proposed charter is the method of amending the charter. It is proposed that the charter be amended by a vote of the voters of the city at a special election. The fifth of the proposed charter is the method of removing the mayor and council members. It is proposed that the mayor and council members be removed by a vote of the voters of the city at a special election. The sixth of the proposed charter is the method of filling vacancies. It is proposed that vacancies in the mayor and council members be filled by the voters of the city at a special election. The seventh of the proposed charter is the method of imposing penalties. It is proposed that the mayor and council members be fined for neglect of duty. The eighth of the proposed charter is the method of imposing penalties. CHAPTER I
NAME, POWERS AND BOUNDARIES
Section 1. The name of the city shall be "Enterprise".
Section 2. The city shall have the power to pass ordinances, to levy taxes, and to manage the city's affairs.

Section 4. The city shall have the power to contract with other cities and towns.
Section 5. The city shall have the power to sue and be sued.
Section 6. The city shall have the power to employ and discharge its officers and employees.
Section 7. The city shall have the power to regulate the health, safety and morals of the city.
Section 8. The city shall have the power to regulate the use of public places.
Section 9. The city shall have the power to regulate the use of public utilities.
Section 10. The city shall have the power to regulate the use of public buildings.

CHAPTER II
OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS
Section 1. The mayor and council members shall be elected by the voters of the city at a general election.
Section 2. The mayor shall be elected for a term of two years and shall have the honor and precedence of a mayor.
Section 3. The city council shall consist of five members, each elected for a term of two years.
Section 4. The mayor and council members shall be eligible for re-election.
Section 5. The mayor and council members shall be subject to removal by a vote of the voters of the city at a special election.
Section 6. The mayor and council members shall be subject to impeachment by the voters of the city at a special election.
Section 7. The mayor and council members shall be subject to disqualification by the voters of the city at a special election.
Section 8. The mayor and council members shall be subject to suspension by the voters of the city at a special election.
Section 9. The mayor and council members shall be subject to expulsion by the voters of the city at a special election.
Section 10. The mayor and council members shall be subject to removal from office by the voters of the city at a special election.

CHAPTER III
MAYOR AND COUNCIL
Section 1. The mayor shall have the power to execute the ordinances of the city and to see that they are faithfully observed.
Section 2. The mayor shall have the power to appoint and discharge the city's officers and employees.
Section 3. The mayor shall have the power to sign and issue the city's warrants and subpoenas.
Section 4. The mayor shall have the power to receive and disburse the city's funds.
Section 5. The mayor shall have the power to represent the city in all legal proceedings.
Section 6. The mayor shall have the power to call special meetings of the city council.
Section 7. The mayor shall have the power to veto the ordinances of the city council.
Section 8. The mayor shall have the power to pardon the city's prisoners.
Section 9. The mayor shall have the power to grant clemency to the city's prisoners.
Section 10. The mayor shall have the power to commute the city's sentences.

CHAPTER IV

Section 1. The city council shall have the power to pass ordinances, to levy taxes, and to manage the city's affairs.
