WHEREAS: Quentin Burdick has shown what a wise and sensible man he is in the fact that he still owns a lake cabin in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota, where he spends his vacation time; and

WHEREAS: Quentin Burdick remains a loyal Minnesota Gopher football fan, although he would still rather be out in the field reliving his days as a Gopher football hero, than up in the stands watching;
