

## **Proclamation**

13 to 18 million people die from hunger and starvation each year, 35,000 people a day, 26,000 of them children under the age of 5; and WHEREAS:

Ending the chronic, persistent hunger that is at the root of these tragic deaths is now

WHEREAS: a real possibility; and

What is needed to fulfill this possibility is a new conversation, a conversation that WHEREAS: will shift the climate of public opinion about ending hunger - a conversation for:

providing people who live in countries where hunger persists with the opportunity they need to end their own hunger, and

having ending hunger become a top priority on the political and economic agendas around the world; and

The 13 million students in our nation's high schools have the potential to significantly impact accomplishing the end of the persistence of hunger; and WHEREAS:

The actions of today's high school students will determine the future of their communities, their nation and the world; and WHEREAS:

Providing Minnesota's young people with education for ending hunger will prepare them for the responsibility of global citizenship; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 10-

ENDING HUNGER EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge Minnesota's educators and citizens to use this week to provide education for the end of hunger to support this vital issue.
