



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Hunger and malnutrition remain daily facts of life for hundreds of millions of people throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS: The children of the world suffer the most serious effects of hunger and malnutrition, with millions of children dying each year from hunger-related illness and disease, and many others suffering permanent physical or mental impairment because of vitamin or protein deficiencies; and
- WHEREAS: Efforts to resolve the world hunger problem are critical to the maintenance of world peace; and
- WHEREAS: Although progress has been made in reducing the incidence of hunger and malnutrition in the United States, certain groups, notably Native Americans, migrant workers, the elderly, and children, remain vulnerable to malnutrition and related diseases; and
- WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota can express their concern for the plight of the hungry and malnourished people throughout the world by fasting and by donating food and money for them;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 16, 1988 to be

WORLD FOOD DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
