

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ORDINANCE NO. 2635

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 12.12, SUBDIVISION 4, PARAGRAPH 4, OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON REGARDING THE SALE AND CONTROL OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR, SPECIFICALLY THE DEFINITION OF THE TERM "CLUB".

The City Council of the City of Bloomington ordains:

Section 1. That this ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Section 410.31 of the Minnesota Statutes.

Section 2. That Section 12.12, Subdivision 4, Paragraph 4, of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Bloomington regarding the sale and control of intoxicating liquor is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 12.12 Intoxicating Liquor.

* * *

Subdivision 4. Definitions.

* * *

(4) The term "club" means and includes any corporation duly organized under the laws of the state for civic, fraternal, social, or business purposes or for the intellectual improvement or for the promotion of sports, which has been in existence for more than [twenty] fifteen years, and any congressionally chartered veterans organization which has been in existence for more than ten years prior to January 1, 1961, which shall have more than fifty members, and which shall, for more than a year, have owned, hired, or leased a building or space in a building of such extent and character as may be suitable and adequate for the reasonable and comfortable accommodation of its members and whose affairs and management are conducted by a board of directors, executive committee, or other similar body chosen by the members at a meeting held for that purpose, none of whose members, officers, agents, or employees are paid directly or indirectly any compensation by way of profit from the distribution or sale of beverages to the members of the club, or to its guests, beyond the amount of a reasonable salary or wages as may be fixed and voted each year by the directors or other governing body.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 90 days after passage and publication.
