

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Floyd W. Roman, Assistant Superintendent of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension is retiring on October 25, 1988 after having served 41 years in Law Enforcement; and

WHEREAS: Floyd Roman spent the first 21 years of his career (1947-1968) with the Richfield Police Department, attaining the rank of Captain; and

WHEREAS: On August 14, 1968, Floyd Roman was hired by the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension to develop and supervise a new traffic training program, and in January, 1970 he was promoted to the position of Assistant Superintendent of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension; and

WHEREAS: Floyd Roman has received numerous awards and commendations throughout his career, and he was the first person selected to the Minnesota Association of Training Officers Hall of Fame for his outstanding contributions to the training and education of law enforcement personnel in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Floyd Roman recently received the "WCCO Good Neighbor Award" in recognition of outstanding service as a good neighbor in the Northwest;


WHEREAS: It is fitting that a day be set aside in Floyd Roman's honor;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, October 25, 1988 to be

in Minnesota.
