- WHEREAS: Lloyd W. Kilmer was born in Minnesota, and received his formal education there; and
- WHEREAS: At the beginning of World War II, Lloyd enlisted in the United States Army Air Corps, became a pilot, and was commissioned a Lieutenant; and
- WHEREAS: Lloyd was shot down over Germany on his 16th mission and was a prisoner of war; and
- WHEREAS: He received many citations and medals for his service to his country, one of which is the prisoner of war medal he received this year, 40 years after he was a prisoner; and
- WHEREAS: Lloyd is being honored again by being selected to receive the George Washington Honor Medal for excellence in the category of Individual Achievement for further service to his country;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, November 11, 1988 to be


