



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Salem Covenant Church was organized on December 17, 1888 by thirteen charter members as the Swedish Evangelical Mission Church of Northeast Minneapolis; and
- WHEREAS: This congregation has been guided by twelve senior pastors at its locations in northeast Minneapolis and in New Brighton during the past one hundred years; and
- WHEREAS: This congregation has ministered to thousands of people during its one hundred years of existence and has grown from its original membership of thirteen to a current membership of approximately 850; and
- WHEREAS: This congregation serves as a church home for persons entering the pastoral ministry, home and foreign mission fields and other areas of Christian service; and
- WHEREAS: The congregation continues to be a spiritual home and a vehicle for proclaiming the Christian ministry to its members as well as to residents of surrounding communities; and
- WHEREAS: Salem Covenant Church is culminating its Centennial Celebration during December, 1988;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, December 17, 1988 to be

in Minnesota.
