- WHEREAS: Youthful vigor and creative and innovative thinking, talents found in each and every young individual, lead through approaches in marketing and selling entrepreneurial products and services to substantial new job creation; and
- WHEREAS: Young entrepreneurs in Minnesota make significant contributions to the State's economy and are the key to future economic growth and preservation of employment opportunities;
- WHEREAS: Young entrepreneurs, through their dedication and fortitude to individual successs and distinction, are at the forefront of both urban and rural revitalization in our great state; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota is one of the leading states providing opportunities for young entrepreneurs and fostering their growth, recognizing their importance to all Minnesotans; and
- WHEREAS: The United States Small Business Administration, supported by national and local organizations, is sponsoring Young Entrepreneur Seminars (YES) in the cities of Brooklyn Park and Duluth;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 22, 1988 to be
