WHEREAS: Frances Minda has been actively contributing to civic life and human relations efforts in her community since 1922; and

WHEREAS: Frances has received many awards for her work, including the Sisterhood Award for humanitarian service from the National Conference of Christians and Jews in May, 1987; and

WHEREAS: As an outstanding member of the National Council of Jewish Women Greater Minneapolis Section (NCJW), Frances was awarded the council's highest honor, the Hannah G. Soloman Award, in April for her work to change and expand the role of women in community life and her leadership in areas of NCJW concern; and

WHEREAS: Frances served on the first Commission on the Status of Women which was established in 1963; and

WHEREAS: Frances served the congregation of Temple Israel for nearly 60 years as the wife of the late Rabbi Albert Minda; and

WHEREAS: Frances Minda's 90th birthday is October 2, 1988, and this exceptional woman deserves a day set aside in her honor;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 2, 1988 to be
