PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Pearl Osten, of the Township of Horwegian Grove, Otter Tail County, Minnesota, was, on October 2, 1927, in the City of Minneapolis, Minnesota, brutually murdered; and

WHEREAS, the identity and whereabouts of the person or persons who committed said murder are to the public authorities unknown; and

WHEREAS, the ends of justice demand the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who committed said crime;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of Minnesota, will cause to be paid out of the Treasury of the State of Minnesota, the sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS, for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who committed the murder of said Pearl Osten, and I nereby reserve to the Governor of the State of Minnesota the sole right to judge and determine to whom and in what proportions said sum shall be paid in case of the apprehension and conviction of said murderer or murderers.
