WHEREAS: Jean has worked as a photographer for the St. Paul Pioneer Press Dispatch since June, 1983, and has also worked at the Minnesota Daily and various community newspapers as a photographer; and

WHEREAS: Jean won the Society of Newspaper Design Photograph Award in 1985 for "Trail of Tears", an account of the African famine, and has won numerous other photojournalism awards; and

WHEREAS: Jean was the photographer for the 1988 Pulitzer Prize-winning story "AIDS in the Heartland", a three-part series written by St. Paul Pioneer Press Dispatch reporter Jacqui Banaszynski, about the life and death of political activist Dick Hanson and his partner Bert Henningson;

WHEREAS: Jean is an extraordinary photographer, who has much talent and ability in her field;
