



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Osteoporosis affects 24 million Americans; and
- WHEREAS: This bone-thinning condition increases the likelihood of fractures; and
- WHEREAS: Osteoporosis is responsible for 1.3 million bone fractures annually, including 250,000 hip fractures; and
- WHEREAS: The proportion of Americans susceptible to osteoporosis is increasing in our society, and safe and effective methods of treatment are not widely available, making prevention of osteoporosis of utmost importance; and
- WHEREAS: Building peak bone mass during childhood and young adulthood is critical to reducing the chances of developing osteoporosis of utmost importance; and
- WHEREAS: A healthy life style, including a well-balanced diet and regular exercise, are important steps in osteoporosis prevention; and
- WHEREAS: The President of the United States has called upon the American public for the fourth consecutive year to observe National Osteoporosis Prevention Week, May 8-14;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 8-14, to be

OSTEOPOROSIS PREVENTION WEEK

in Minnesota.
