

## Proclamation

- On Tuesday, July 12, 1988, ceremonies will be held for the grand opening of the Minnesota Women's Building, located at 550 Rice Street in St. Paul; and WHEREAS:
- This completely renovated building is called "a symbol of the arrival of women in the public life of Minnesota" by Gloria Griffin, president of the Minnesota Women's Consortium; and WHEREAS:
- The Women's Building was purchased, developed and will be managed by a three-organization partnership including the Minnesota Women's Consortium, Chrysalis and the League of Women Voters Education Fund; and WHEREAS:
- A successful \$650,000 fundraising effort made it possible for this to be debt-free and self-sustaining building to be rented by nonprofit women's organizations; and WHEREAS:
- The Midwest Area Foundation was the first contributor of funds for the building, which was followed by many area foundations contributions, along with numerous other donations ranging from \$5 to \$75,000 grants; and WHEREAS:
- Top professional women from the Twin Cities area have donated much time and effort for the Women's Building, including Susan Sands, from S & B Properties, who located the building; Peggy Lucas, of Brighton Development, who represented the League of Women WHEREAS: Voters, and put together an effective development team; Gayle Trebesch, the Women's Building's financial consultant; Penny Hunt, as a real-estate law expert; and Mary Grace Flannery, a community development advisor; and
- The Minnesota Women's Building is a place for women in Minnesota to come to share their resources, and will help women's groups build more strength and harmony among WHEREAS:
