WHEREAS: The Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., dedicated his life to achieving racial equality through non-violent social change; and

WHEREAS: In honor of this great civil rights leader, the United States Congress and the Minnesota State Legislature declared January 20, 1986, as the first observance of the Martin Luther King, Jr., holiday; and

WHEREAS: This day will allow us to reflect upon Dr. King's contributions as a theologian, scholar, orator, philosopher, humanitarian, dreamer and leader; and

WHEREAS: This day will serve as a reminder that as long as any one group in our society is in bondage, none of us is truly free;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, January 16, 1989 to be

in Minnesota.


