

Proclamation

Motor vehicle accidents are the number one cause of death of children over six months WHEREAS: of age; and

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of crippling, spinal cord injuries, epilepsy, and mental retardation in the United States; and WHEREAS:

All fifty states and the District of Columbia have enacted laws mandating the use of WHEREAS: federally approved child safety seats; and

Correct use of child passenger protection systems can reduce the chance of death or WHEREAS:

injury during a car crash by over 70 percent; and

Only 70 percent of Minnesota's infants and 30 percent of Minnesota's young children are secured in child safety seats when reding in automobiles; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: Nearly 75 percent of child safely seats are used incorrectly; and

Death and injuries may be greatly reduced through public awareness and enforcement of WHEREAS: Minnesota's Child Passenger Protection Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 12-18, 1989 to be

> CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK

and encourage the citizens of Minnesota to observe the week by remembering, when traveling by automobile with young children, to properly secure them in federally approved child safety seats, and by reminding family and friends to do so.
