

Proclamation


- WHEREAS: The military decoration known as the Badge of Military Merit was created on August 7, 1782, by General George Washington, to honor those enlisted personnel who had distinguished themselves in the defense of their country; and
- WHEREAS: In 1932 the Badge of Military Merit became the Military Order of the Purple Heart; to awarded to those military personnel wounded during the defense of our nation; and
- WHEREAS: Citizens of Minnesota have served honorably in all wars and conflicts of this nation; and
- WHEREAS: Many Minnesotans have been awarded the Military Order of the Purple Heart, in recognition of their sacrifices in defense of our state and nation; and
- WHEREAS: 1989 marks the two-hundred and sixth year anniversary of this military award; and
- WHEREAS: It is entirely fitting and proper that the State of Minnesota recognize and honor those individuals who made such tremendous sacrifices to ensure those freedoms we all enjoy;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 25, 1989 to be

in Minnesota, and I urge all citizens to show their support for veterans who have received the Military Order of the Purple Heart.


