



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Burnsville is located along the scenic Minnesota river, just 16 miles southwest of Minneapolis/St. Paul; and
- WHEREAS: The city of Burnsville ranks seventh in population in the state and is the largest city in Dakota County; and
- WHEREAS: The Burnsville Park and Recreation System contains 69 parks totaling 1,600 acres; and
- WHEREAS: Construction and permit valuations in the city have increased from \$58.8 million in 1978 to \$105.6 million in 1988; and
- WHEREAS: Burnsville has become the third largest retail city in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: The city of Burnsville is served by some of the finest schools in the metropolitan area with comprehensive curriculum and strong extracurricular activity programs; and
- WHEREAS: The city of Burnsville will show its commitment to amateur athletics by hosting the Star of the North State Games from June 16-25, 1989;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

THE CITY OF BURNSVILLE

to be "Capital For A Day" on March 16, 1989.
