



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Minneapolis boasts a wonderful combination of lakes and parks, skyscrapers and small businesses; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Minneapolis is dedicated to the concept of strong, healthy neighborhoods and families; and
- WHEREAS: Minneapolis has economic activity which increased from \$10 billion in 1977 to nearly \$26.6 billion in 1987; and
- WHEREAS: In retail sales, Minneapolis ranks fifth in the country, after New York, Chicago, Boston, and San Francisco; and
- WHEREAS: The first phase of a new 700,000 Minneapolis Convention Center opens in 1989; and
- WHEREAS: The Minneapolis Park and Recreation System, which includes 6,500 acres of land, is visited annually by over 6 million people; and
- WHEREAS: Minneapolis is a nationally recognized center for a rapid growing film, video, and recording industry; and
- WHEREAS: Minneapolis schools offer outstanding opportunities which are designed to match the learning needs of students; and the city is home to a major university and several fine colleges; and
- WHEREAS: Minneapolis is a leading cultural and artistic center for Minnesota and the five-state region; and
- WHEREAS: Minneapolis is the home of the Monarch, the Twins, the Vikings, the Gophers, and the Timberwolves;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

to be "Capital For A Day" on February 22, 1989.


