WHEREAS: East of the Missouri River lies the land area in the State of North Dakota which was part of Minnesota Territory from the year 1849 to the year 1858; and

WHEREAS: North Dakota was made a state in the year 1889, thus it celebrates its 100th anniversary of statehood in 1989; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, March 7, 1989 to be

in Minnesota.
