WHEREAS: Minnesota's rich information resources are essential to the state's effort to promote literacy and learning, to create information age jobs, and to assure a viable and vital economy; and

WHEREAS: Minnesotans enjoy access to those information resources through over three thousand schools, academic, special and public libraries; and

WHEREAS: Emerging information and communications technologies open up unprecedented possibilities for resource sharing and cost-effective management of libraries; and

WHEREAS: Information age skills prepare Minnesota's youth to excel in the global economy and multicultural environment of tomorrow; and

WHEREAS: State support for libraries, for networks that link libraries, and for inclusion of information skills in the core curriculum is a sound, far-sighted public investment;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 21, 1989 to be

LIBRARY LEGISLATION DAY


in Minnesota.


