



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Matt Blair's Celebrity Promotions, with the support of Catholic Charities, will be hosting the 2nd Annual World's Largest Volleyball Game at the Metrodome in Minneapolis on April 11, 1989; and

WHEREAS: Ten nets will be strung together across the middle of the Metrodome for one large Volleyball Game on the 100 x 100 yard floor of the dome, and using ten balls at one time, up to 2500 players per side will participate in the main game; and

WHEREAS: The purpose of this exciting event is to raise money for programs assisting the homeless; and

WHEREAS: The 2nd Annual World's Largest Volleyball Game will also provide a source of excitement and entertainment for its participants and spectators; and

WHEREAS: Local celebrities, including politicians, professional athletes, and radio personalities will participate in the 2nd Annual World's Largest Volleyball game; and

WHEREAS: Participants are to be commended for their concern over the serious and ever growing problem of homelessness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 11 to be

WORLD'S LARGEST VOLLEYBALL GAME DAY

in Minnesota.
