

Proclamation

- From the inception of this nation, it has been the responsibility of the states and their local governments to adopt legislation and enforce laws and ordinances whenever necessary to protect their citizens' health, welfare and safety; and WHEREAS:
- It has been a fundamental part of the democratic principles of this nation to involve all interested and affected parties from both the public and private sectors in the formulation, adoption and, to the fullest extent possible, in the administration of WHEREAS: such laws and ordinances; and
- Among the most basic of the laws and ordinances which have been so derived are those acts which assure the public's health and safety in the buildings in which people live, WHEREAS: work and play; and
- To assure such safety, the State of Minnesota, working together and in conjunction with the counties and cities and townships across this state, enforces a uniform state-wide building code which has been designed and is maintained with the assistance of the WHEREAS: building industry and the consumers; and
- It is through the untiring efforts of state and local building officials and their cooperative relationship with the construction industry that the administration of these health and life-safety regulations is assured; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 9-15, 1989 to be

BUILDING SAFETY WEEK

in Minnesota.
