



Proclamation

WHEREAS: In Minnesota, 39.2% of the women with children under age two work, 53.6% of the women with children between two and four work, 60.5% of women with children five years old work, and 66.7% of the women with children six and over work; and

WHEREAS: More than 85,000 children in Minnesota are being cared for in licensed care; and

WHEREAS: There are over 10,000 licensed family child care providers and nearly 1,100 licensed centers creating a total estimate of 25,000 jobs in child care in the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Children are our society's most precious resource and their nurturance and caring are a vital necessity to our society; and

WHEREAS: Children deserve the best care society can give them when their parents are unable to care for them; and

WHEREAS: The people who take care of these children deserve to be highly respected and valued;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 14, 1989 to be

CHILD CARE WORKER DAY

In Minnesota.
