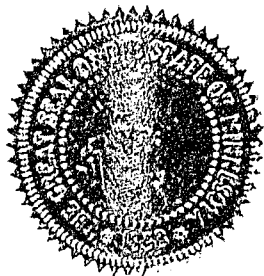
WHEREAS: L. Jill Cook has proven her dedication to education in the State of Minnesota through her work with the Geography Bee and her outstanding contributions as a teacher;
