

Proclamation

- The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6316, located in Blaine, Minnesota, is named after Sergeant John Rice, United States Army; and WHEREAS:
- Sergeant John Rice was a career US Army Sergeant who enlisted shortly after the bombing of Pearl Harbor; served 40 months in the Pacific; was wounded in battle; contracted malaria; won a Bronze Star Medal, and gave his life in the Korea Conflict; and WHEREAS:
- WHEREAS: Upon return of his body to the United States, he was denied burial in Sioux City, Iowa, because he was an American Indian; and
- Through the intervention of then President Harry S. Truman, Sergeant John Rice was buried with full military honors in Arlington National Cemetery; and WHEREAS:
- The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6316 in Blaine, Minnesota, has chosen to perpetuate the memory of Sergeant Rice and is having a re-dedication of the Post Home with a permanent bronze memorial to his memory on May 7, 1989; WHEREAS:
