



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Dakota County has demonstrated leadership in addressing the problems of solid waste, by establishing household hazardous waste collections, a yardwaste compost facility, county-wide curbside and drop-off recycling, and a recycling collection center; and
- WHEREAS: The county, cities, and townships of Dakota County have created a unique partnership to provide recycling opportunities to every resident; and
- WHEREAS: Every city and township in the county now offers weekly or bi-weekly curbside collection and containers for recyclable materials; and
- WHEREAS: Dakota County's efforts have already placed it in the top two percent of the nation's counties in the percentage of waste recycled; and
- WHEREAS: Every Dakota County resident is urged to "Recycle! Be Part of the Solution;" and
- WHEREAS: Dakota County has advanced in less than one year from limited recycling opportunities to convenient recycling programs available throughout the county;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 11, 1989 to be

DAKOTA COUNTY RECYCLES DAY

in Minnesota.

FURTHERMORE, I commend the residents, businesses, cities, townships, and the Dakota County Board of Commissioners and staff, for their commitment to recycling as part of an integrated approach to solid waste management.
