

WHEREAS: Eleanor Morton has given many years of service to religious education including seven years as Religious Education Consultant at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Minnetonka; and

WHEREAS: During these years, Eleanor Morton provided professional leadership for religious education programs; developed educational curriculum units on world religions, and religious values and ethics; introduced various programs in the arts; started a five-week "peace curriculum" which taught children nonviolent ways to deal with interpersonal problems; involved children in service projects that raised money for Ronald McDonald House and Christmas gifts; and provided teacher training and support as well as parent education classes; and

WHEREAS: Eleanor Morton also served as director of religious education at the First Unitarian Society of Minneapolis as well as at the Minnesota Valley Unitarian Universalist Fellowship and has been active at district and continental levels of the Unitarian Universalist Association including chairing the district Education and Program Development Committee for six years; and

WHEREAS: Eleanor Morton has been guided by the beliefs that religious training should not stamp preconceived ideas of religion on the minds of young people, but should teach them to develop their own conscience and morality, growing within their religion and, in doing so, to cause their religion to grow with them;
