



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Elmer L. Andersen was born in Chicago on June 17, 1909; and
- WHEREAS: As a young man, he came to Minnesota to obtain an education at the University of Minnesota, and begin his long and successful career with the H.B. Fuller Company; and
- WHEREAS: In 1949 Elmer L. Andersen was chosen to serve his fellow citizens as a State Senator from District 42, a post he held until 1958; and
- WHEREAS: In 1960 Elmer L. Andersen was elected the 30th Governor of the State of Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: As a naturalist, Elmer L. Andersen was instrumental in the establishment of Voyageurs National Park, Minnesota's only national park. Elmer L. Andersen also is a long time supporter of the University of Minnesota Landscape Arboretum; and
- WHEREAS: The furtherment of education, arts and culture has always been of utmost concern to Elmer L. Andersen. Over the years he has given his time and knowledge to the numerous organizations within our state that foster these disciplines, including service as member and chairman of the University of Minnesota Board of Regents; and
- WHEREAS: It is evident that as a public official and private citizen, Elmer L. Andersen has given his life to the betterment of Minnesota and its people;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 11-17, 1989 to be
