I hereby certify that the Village Council of the Village of New Germany, Carver County, have complied with Sec. 1126, Statutes of Minnesota, 1923, by filing with me their certificate as required by said section 1126, to the effect that said Village of New Germany has separated from the Township of Camden to become a separate assessment and election district.

I further certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the certificate of said New Germany Village Council filed in my office, viz., -

"This is to certify that at the regular village election held in the Village of New Germany, Minnesota, the proposition as to whether or not said village should separate from the Township of Camden in said county so as to constitute a separate election and assessment district, was submitted to the electors of said village. The number of votes in favor of said proposition was 58 and the number of votes against said proposition was 11. Therefore said proposition carried by 47 votes. The result of said election on said proposition was duly certified to the Village Council of said Village by the Judges of Election and therein entered in the minutes kept by said Village Council.

You are hereby notified ~~that~~ of the result of said election that said proposition duly carried.
