

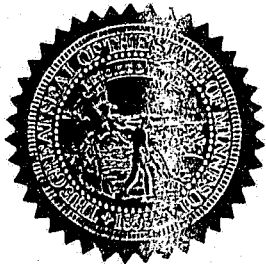


## Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Roy Wilkins was raised in St. Paul and was graduated from the University of Minnesota in 1923; and
- WHEREAS: Roy Wilkins went on to work for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People for 46 years; and
- WHEREAS: Roy Wilkins was a dedicated civil rights leader and an articulate voice for equal rights for black people in the United States; and
- WHEREAS: As Minnesotans, we are proud of our native son and of his legacy of commitment to make all men and women equal;
- WHEREAS: Here in the home state of Roy Wilkins, we are blessed with an institution that trains committed minds to follow the example of leaders like Roy Wilkins; and
- WHEREAS: The Hubert Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs will be represented on June 23, and the establishment of the Roy Wilkins Chair at the Institute will be the focus of the Fourth Annual Salute To Roy Wilkins to be held at Canterbury Downs;
