

Proclamation

The Minnesota Amateur Sports Commission created the Star of the North State Games in WHEREAS: cooperation with the United States Olympic Committee, to provide the chance for Minnesotans of all ages, creeds, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds to become actively involved in an Olympic-style competition; and

The Minnesota Star of the North State Games, which is in its second year, is already recognized as the largest amateur multi-sport event in the state; and WHEREAS:

The games allow all participants the chance to demonstrate their individual athletic potential; and WHEREAS:

The 1989 Star of the North State Games are being held in Burnsville June 16-25, and WHEREAS: will feature more than 40 sport competitions, including divisions for disabled athletes and special athletes; and

Gold, silver and bronze medallions depicting the Star of the North State Games emblem will be awarded to the top three finishers in each event; and WHEREAS:

The Opening Ceremonies for the Star of the North State Games will include performances WHEREAS: by marching bands, ethnic dancers and choirs, and a statewide torch run, beginning on the steps of the State Capitol;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 16, 1989 to be

STAR OF THE NORTH GAMES DAY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eightynine, and of the State the one hundred thirty-first.
