

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Wetlands in Mumesota and throughout the nation have been destroyed at a distressing rate, contributing to a decline in waterfowl numbers that are at an all-time low; and

WHEREAS: Wetlands provide benefits to all Minnesotans by reducing flooding, purifying and recharging groundwater, providing vital habitat for fish and wildlife, and sites for outdoor recreation; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota Department of Transportation, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service have worked together to create the state's largest single wetland under the Wetland Mitigation Banking program; and

WHEREAS: The Rice Lake Restaration Project embodies Minnesota's commitment to conservation through multi-agency cooperation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim that the

be commended for its role in this and other wetland restorations that benefit the citizens of Minnesota for both this and future generations.
