- WHEREAS: Fred E. Lukermann is a native son of Minnesota who earned undergraduate and graduate degrees at the University of Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: Fred E. Lukermann has been a member of the faculty at the University of Minnesota for 35 years and during that time has been an outstanding teacher, scholar and citizen; and
- WHEREAS: Fred E. Lukermann has also enjoyed a distinguished administrative career including four years as department chair, six years as Assistant Vice President for Academic Administration and eleven years as Dean of the College of Liberal Arts; and
- WHEREAS: Fred E. Lukermann's academic career has been characterized by his vision for the Arts and Sciences, his assiduousness in making theory into practice and his devotion to disciplined inquiry and equality; and
- WHEREAS: Fred E. Lukermann has now chosen to return to full-time teaching and scholarship and this is the first day of his emancipation from decanal responsibility; and
