WHEREAS: Harriet Tubman was one of the most courageous women in history. She was born in bondage about 1821, in Bucktown on the Eastern shore of Maryland; and	
WHEREAS: She escaped to freedom on the Underground Railroad during the summer of 1849 and became, "the 19th Century's most outstanding figure." Her freedom became a mission to free others and she returned to the South nineteen times to help others to freedom, while risking her own life and freedom; and	
WHEREAS: She served courageously as a soldier, spy, scout, nurse, and cook during the Civil War, but was never rewarded for her military service or her endless efforts for the cause of freedom; and	
WHEREAS: After the war she settled in her home in Auburn, New York and continued to fight for the homeless/elderly, education and human rights; and	
WHEREAS: On March 10, 1913, Harriet Tubman, a woman called Moses, died in her home for the retired;	
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 10, 1990 to be

in Minnesota, in honor of her, and in remembrance of her undying faith and courage to make the world	
a better place to live.
