

Proclamation

WHEREAS: In 1914, two young Swedes founded the Hupmobile, the country's first Greyhound Bus, in Hibbing, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: In commemoration of this historic event, The Bus Origin Center has been developed in Hibbing; and

WHEREAS: The center shows the evolution of the bus industry until the present time, and the displays include a bus motor donated by Greyhound Corporation, a mock-up of a bus, a coin collector used on buses in the 1930's, weather conditions during the early years of the bus industry, bus drivers' memories, uniforms of bus drivers over the years, and a map of the first bus route; and

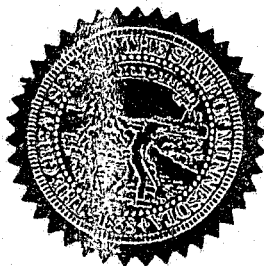
WHEREAS: Gene Nicoletti, is proud to be the Director of the Bus Origin Center, after many years of struggling to bring the center to life; and
