



## Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Joyce Lamont worked at WCCO Radio for 43 years; 39 of which she was on the air; and
- WHEREAS: Her early work at WCCO, where she started working immediately after graduating from the University of Minnesota, consisted of writing commercial and air copy; and
- WHEREAS: She later began her invaluable work on the air, which over the years has included reading recipes, announcing special events occurring throughout the state, a half hour religious choral show on Sunday mornings featuring Minnesota College choirs, the Dayton's Musical Chimes show with Howard Viken, and the Best Buys Show sponsored by Jerry's Foods; and
- WHEREAS: Joyce soon became a favorite with WCCO Radio listeners, receiving 2000 letters a week at times, including requests for recipes and publicity, and fan mail; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout her years at WCCO Radio, Joyce proved herself to be a dedicated, out-going, reliable and good natured employee; and
- WHEREAS: Joyce Lamont and Howard Viken were the Grand Marshals of the 1989 Aquatennial Grand Day Parade; and
- WHEREAS: It is fitting to set aside a day to honor this special woman who has done such an extraordinary community service for the Twin Cities, and for the entire State of Minnesota;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, August 14, 1989 to be
