WHEREAS: The Miss Black Minnesota Pageant recognizes the achievements of young Black women in education, politics, the arts and community service;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim July 8, 1989 to be

in Minnesota, in honor of the Pageant participants and those associated with making the Pageant a reality.


