



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Sixth National Cerebral Palsy Games will take place on the campus of Mankato State University on July 12-17, 1989; and

WHEREAS: The Games will bring in between 750-1,000 top athletes and coaches from around the nation; and

WHEREAS: Many of the athletes involved in the 1989 National Cerebral Palsy Games participated in the 1988 Seoul paralympics which were held in Seoul, Korea following the 1988 Summer Olympics; and

WHEREAS: The Games' events include bowling, powerlifting, cross country, bicycling, swimming, bocchia, archery, horseback riding, slalom, soccer, wheelchair team handball, table tennis, and several different track and field events; and

WHEREAS: Opening Ceremonies will be held Thursday, July 13 in Highland Arena;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim July 13, 1989 to be

in Minnesota, and welcome the athletes, their coaches and their supporters to our state.
