WHEREAS: It is the purpose of the Minnesota Space Week organizers to promote national debates on present and proposed uses and directions of our journeys into space;

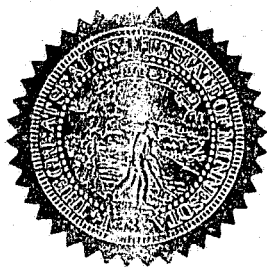
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of July 16 through July 24 to be
