

Proclamation

In July, 1869 a group of pioneer men in Wells, Minnesota began building a wooden building, which was to become the school house for the district; and WHEREAS:

The school opened in 1870; the building cost \$1,500 and was built on land given by Colonel Clark Thompson, the founder of Wells, for one dollar; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: In 1884, the school received its first two dictionaries, and that was the beginning of

its library; and

For twenty-five years Wells was the only school in the county with a kindergarten, and also the only one with a Home Economics department; and WHEREAS:

In 1933 the east side of the present three-story building was built, and the west wing and gymnasium were added in 1953; and WHEREAS:

In 1955, the Easton public school district, grades 7-12, consolidated with the Wells School District to form the present Wells-Easton School District; and WHEREAS:

On June 30 and July 1-2, Well-Easton Public Schools will celebrate their 100th birthday with class reunions, open houses, athletic events, an antique auto show, an old photo and memorabilia display, a staff picnic, and more;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 30th, July 1st and July 2nd to be

WELLS-EASTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DAYS

in Minnesota, in honor of their Centennial.
