- Greg Lemond is the winner of the 1989 Tour de France; and WHEREAS:
- Greg has proven his exceptional ability as an athlete in recovering from a near-fatal hunting injury which occurred in 1987, to win this cycling classic; and WHEREAS:
- WHEREAS: Greg also took first place in the Tour de France in 1986, becoming the first American
 - to win the race; and
- The Tour de France, which began on July 1 in Luxembourg, covered approximately 2,000 miles through Luxembourg, Belgium and France, with one of the most grueling courses in the history of the race, as four days were spent in the Alps, in an intense heat; WHEREAS:
- WHEREAS: Minnesotans were captivated as they followed Greg's suspenseful and exciting race, during which he overcame a 50-second deficit on the final leg of the race, giving him an eight second victory; and
