It is estimated that between one and 1.8 million persons experience brain injuries in the United States each year, resulting in more than 100,000 deaths from these WHEREAS:

Each year, 50,000 or more survivors must face the permanent physical, cognitive and WHEREAS:

emotional consequences of brain injury; and

Even people experiencing less serious brain injuries may face months of rehabilitation or permanent loss of a prior ability or skill; and WHEREAS:

Additional hardships can result from mounting medical costs, difficulties with the job or loss of employment and strained personal relationships; and WHEREAS:

In Minnesota alone, we can expect 9,600 new cases of brain injuries to occur during the WHEREAS:

coming year; and
