



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: 360,000 Minnesotans have physical disabilities; and
- WHEREAS: People with disabilities have the same inalienable rights and responsibilities as all other Minnesota citizens; and
- WHEREAS: Inaccessible programs and facilities deny citizens with disabilities the opportunity to work, travel, go to school, and participate in leisure activities; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota is recognized as a leader in providing opportunities which promote the independence of persons with disabilities; and
- WHEREAS: The passage of "Access '92" which will make all state owned buildings and facilities accessible to all citizens with disabilities demonstrates Minnesota's commitment and leadership in this area; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Access Achievement Awards highlight the outstanding contributions many people have made to making Minnesota accessible to everyone;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, October 7, 1989 to be

MINNESOTA ACCESS DAY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-nine, and of the State the one hundred thirty-first.
