People with disabilities have the same inallenable rights and responsibilities as all other Minnesota citizens; and * WHEREAS:

Inaccessible programs and facilities deny citizens with disabilities the opportunity to work, travel, go to school, and participate in leisure activities; and WHEREAS:

Minnesota is recognized as a leader in providing opportunities which promote the independence of persons with disabilities; and WHEREAS:

The passage of "Access '92" which will make all state owned buildings and facilities accessible to all citizens with disabilities demonstrates Minnesota's commitment and WHEREAS:

leadership in this area; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Access Achievement Awards highlight the outstanding contributions many

people have made to making Minnesota accessible to everyone;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, October 7, 1989 to be

MINNESOTA ACCESS DAY

in Minnesota.
