WHEREAS: Physician assistants are skilled members of the health care team who, working

dependently under the supervision of licensed physicians, provide a broad range of

medical services; and

WHEREAS: There are approximately 200 physician assistants in the State of Minnesota who provide

quality health care in clinics, hospitals, nursing homes and other health care

settings; and

WHEREAS: Physician assistants have distinguished themselves with their dedication to their

profession by their public education, research, data collection and their assistance in

the selection of the accessibility and quality of health care; and

WHEREAS: This year is an important year for physician assistants because it marks the 22nd

anniversary of founding of this health care profession, and the 13th year since the

foundation of the Minnesota Academy of Physician Assistants;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 6,

1989 to be

"PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT DAY"

in Minnesota, in honor of this event and do further urge all citizens to recognize the valuable contributions physician assistants make to health care in our state and nation.
